INGREDIENTS

Position the blocks 50 to 70 feet from the loafing, feeding and watering areas. Some repositioning of the blocks may be necessary as the animals become acclimated to the presence of the blocks. directed. Move blocks closer to increase consumption, further 5 Consumption of selenium should not exceed 3 away to decrease consumption. If overconsumption occurs for more than two weeks and repositioning of the blocks does not correct the situation, remove 6. the blocks and evaluate the overall feeding program.

#### FEEDING RECOMMENDATIONS

- Feed at a rate of one block per 5 to 15 head. All animals should have equal access to blocks. Timid and smaller animals need their share.
- Place blocks where animals congregate. Locate blocks throughout the pasture at loafing, grazing and watering areas. Adequate distance must be maintained between blocks to prevent crowding -10 feet minimum.
- Do not allow animals to run out of blocks. When a block is two-thirds consumed, provide a new block near is. Place very small pieces in a feed pan or trough to be cleaned up.
- Cattle and horses should consume 2 to 4 ounces per head daily.
- Blocks can be fed to animals in confinement. Exact location of blocks to obtain desired consumption will vary between confinement feeding programs. Feed as the only self-fed sources of salt, minerals and vitamins. Provide a source of clean, fresh
